#### Facility Information:

HSPC operates as an animal control holding facility for Portage County (with the exceptions of Town of Buena Vista, Nelsonville, and Junction City) and also accepts owner surrenders. The facility consists of a single building with indoor/outdoor enclosures with guillotine gates, there are 3 main housing areas within the building.

ADOBTABLE - Dogs that are in an adoptable status are housed within one of 15 enclosures. They measure approximately 5' x 4' indoors and have a connected outdoor run that is 4' x 9'. Indoor enclosures are separated by solid walls and a chain link door. All adoptable dogs can be viewed from the hallway windows. Outdoor portions are covered and separated by chain link fencing. In winter months tarps are hung to block wind. Dogs have access to clean water throughout the day and are typically fed twice a day unless an alternate schedule is needed.

STRAY/SURRENDER - When dogs are first brought into the shelter and not available for adoption they are placed in one of 13 enclosures in another room. These enclosures are identical to the adoptable dog are measuring approximately 5' x 4' indoors and have a connected outdoor run that is 4' x 9'. Indoor enclosures are separated by solid walls and a chain link door. All dogs can be viewed from the hallway windows. Outdoor portions are covered and separated by chain link fencing. In winter months tarps are hung to block wind. Dogs have access to clean water throughout the day and are typically fed twice a day unless an alternate schedule is needed.

QUARANTINE - There are two separate quarantine areas. The first is used for non-contagious quarantine and may also be used for isolation after/before surgery. The three enclosures are approximately 5' x 4' indoors and outdoors run that is 4' x 9'. The second area has two enclosures of the same size with indoor/outdoor access. This room has its own ventilation from the rest of the building. Outdoor enclosures are wrapped with tarps in winter to minimize cold air flow.

EXERCISE & ENRICHMENT - There are 4-outdoor play yards on concrete with a covered roof, again in winter months the outdoor area is half wrapped in plastic to block wind. There are two other large outdoor play yards on grass with solid structure fencing. Dogs are rotated through the yards throughout the day. Dogs also receive leashed walks with volunteers. Officers, hallways, other rooms are used for additional time outside of the kennel enclosures. Times vary depending on dog and situation but typically dogs spend 8 hours outside of their primary enclosures. Within enclosures dogs are provided bedding, blankets, toys and chews. The amount of exercise each dog receives daily is recorded in a management document and a visual sign out chart has been created.

RECORDS - Electronic database and handwritten records are kept.
