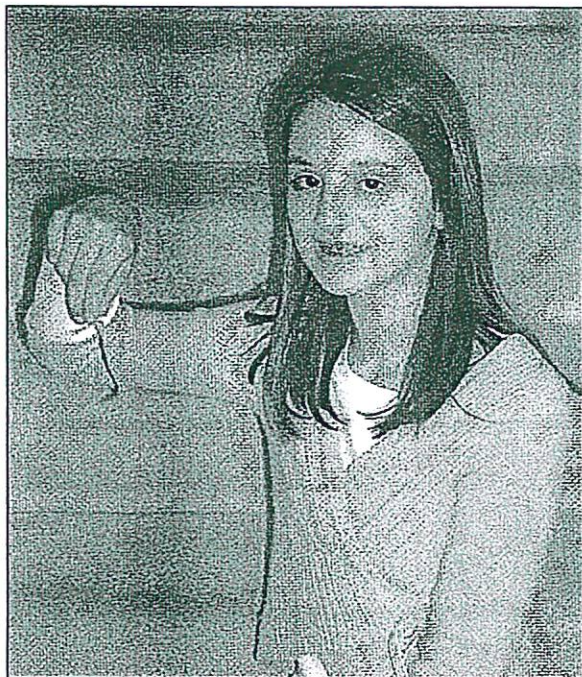
## HANDS HELPING PAWS

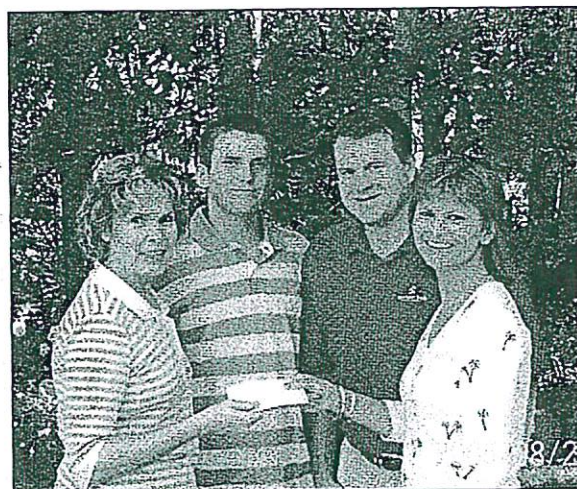

December 4, 2005 was a typical workday for me, but later it turned out to be one of the most memorable days of working at the HSPC. I received a call in the morning about a dog that was found in a Plover greenhouse. The people that called stated that the dog had a collar and tags, and a leash attached. The dog had apparently been in the greenhouse for about a week; because that was the last time it was unlocked. They transported the dog up to the shelter. I looked at the tags, she had a dog license on, and a rabies tag, on the back was the name "Anna" with a

phone number. I felt that the dog had been gone from their house for a little longer than a week. I called the number and told them that I had their dog Anna. I then asked how long she had been missing. The reply was "4 months". I had to ask again to make sure I was hearing things correctly, and it was indeed since July that the dog had been missing. They came down immediately to pick up their long lost family member. It was without a doubt the best reunion I have witnessed. The Kinney's came in and I went in back to get Anna. Immediately Anna knew exactly who they were, even after all that time. I asked if the leash Anna had on was theirs, and it was not. I believe Anna was living with someone else for that time.

I spoke with Jason and Joni Kinney and they had told me the story of how Anna came to be lost. Joni had given birth to Cheyenne on July 20<sup>th</sup>, and because everyone was at the hospital, Joni's parents went to let Anna out to go to the bathroom. Anna snuck out the door and was gone. That night there were several sightings of Anna, and Greta who was working, went out to try to help find her with Jason. They never ended up finding her. Jason and Joni never gave up hope, checking our website weekly for any dog that matched her description. Joni and Jason came in on December 1<sup>st</sup> because a stray heeler mix was posted on our site, but it was not Anna. Only 3 days later, she was found. The Kinney's in that time had also adopted another cat in addition to the one they already had, both adopted from the HSPC. I spoke with Jason a few weeks after they took Anna back home, I'm happy to report the whole family is doing great! The moral of the story is, always keep tags on your animal, always report stray animals, and never give up hope if they go missing. Miracles can happen.



While visiting the shelter a few weeks ago I saw a cute, peach-colored kitten names "Austin" sitting in the office. He appeared to have something wrong with his eyes and Jenny, one of the humane officers, told me that they were infected when he was brought into the shelter. Unfortunately, the infection was so severe that his eyes were permanently damages and he has limited eyesight. I decided right then to bring him home and after conferring with my husband and filling out the necessary paperwork we gladly adopted Austin the day after Thanksgiving.

Once we got him home you would not have known that he could not see very well because he immediately started running around the house at 100 miles per hour chasing all of our adult cats and figuring out where t

All things of importance to him were located (cat box, food, toys, and a good place to take a nap). Austin's favorite playmate is our 15-pound Maine Coon cat, Felix, who also comes from the shelter. Five pound Austin thinks nothing of jumping on Felix's back and starting a good wrestling match. When he is not playing with Felix, his favorite thing to do is climb the Christmas tree, so we're hoping he will outgrow that habit by next Christmas!

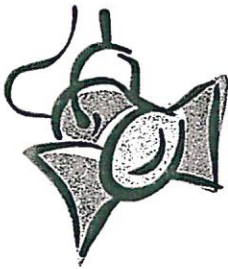

## Staff and Volunteer Spotlight



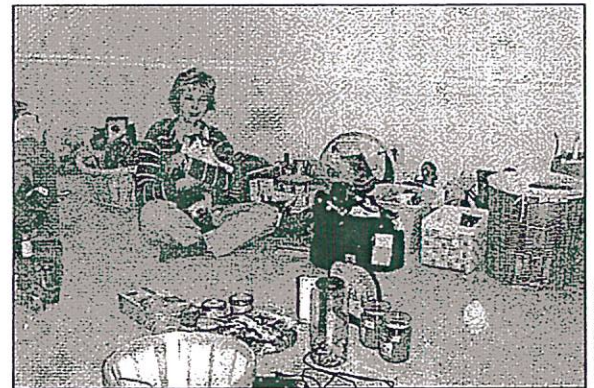

## Foster Homes

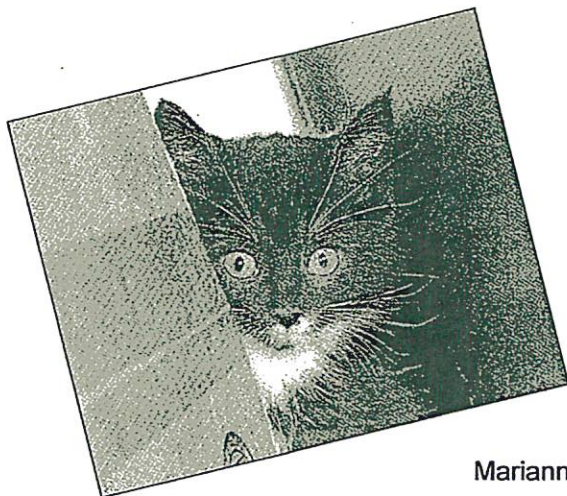
